SPARES: All curlers are responsible to obtain a SPARE for any games they are unavailable to curl. If spare required, go to spare list first and then the Bye team. If you are still unable to arrange for a spare, please advise your skip.

NOTE: THE COMMITTEE WILL ARRANGE ALL SPARES FOR PLAYOFF GAMES

DEFINITION OF SPARE: A spare, at the discretion of the skip can play any position up to and including the position of the player away. However, if the skip is absent, the Vice must SKIP and the spare can play any position up to and including Vice. If both skip and vice away one Spare must skip and the other spare play lead. The second will Vice and the lead will play second position. NO EXCEPTIONS

NOTE: If teams are tied at the end of the schedule the tie breaker will go firstly to the Team who won head to head game, if applicable. If not Team with most wins and if still tied will cut cards. High card winning tie breaker
